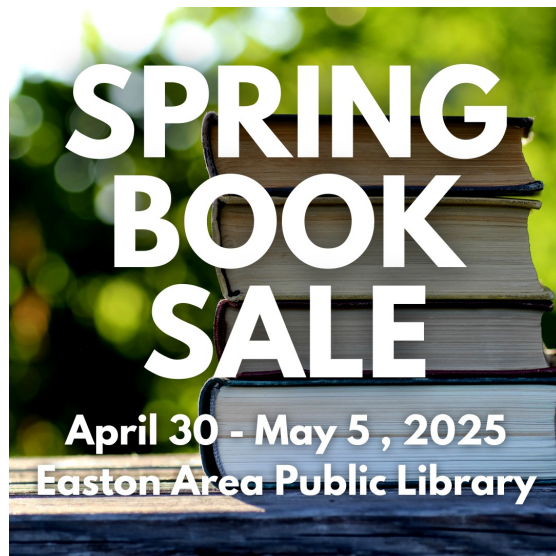

### **Dog Man Afternoon (Palmer)**

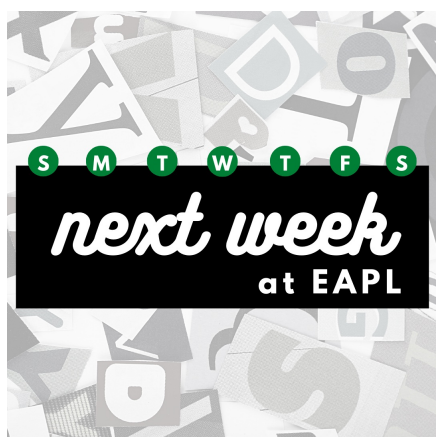
